

Volunteering opportunity – Wheee! Festival 2018

This is an exciting opportunity for volunteers to get involved with Nottingham Lakeside Arts' *Wheee! Festival*. We are looking for people to take on customer facing stewarding roles, helping out at the festival throughout the weekend. This would include showing families where to go, letting the public know when and where different events are happening, working as a shadow artist, supporting the facilitating artists with hands on make and do activities (all training will be given), being tour guides, working with our Highfield Park Rangers, helping families take part in outdoor trails and activities, and generally being an ambassador for Lakeside. This is a fantastic opportunity for volunteers to pick up some new skills and have an enjoyable weekend working with young children and families.



Who will suit this opportunity?

Friendly University students or staff, and members of the local community who would like to be part of our annual children's festival. Volunteers will ideally have some experience of working with the public, enjoy outdoor activities and a festive, family atmosphere and be willing to work alongside professional artists. Volunteers must be over 16 years of age.

Date and times

Shifts will be available on Saturday 2 and Sunday the 3 June, 2018.
Shifts will be from 10.00 – 17.30 (breaks are included). Lunch provided.

Volunteers must be able to work the entire shift. We will consider applications from those who can only work 1 day.

The Role

Nottingham Lakeside Arts supports students, staff, alumni and community members to take part in wider university life. Volunteering opportunities include supporting a range of activities from large-scale, public facing events to smaller arts and heritage related activities on and off Campus.

This specific opportunity allows volunteers to work directly alongside Lakeside staff and local and national professional artists as part of wider *Wheee! Festival* team. Volunteers will also gain experience from involvement in a major festival and engaging with the public and members of the local community who visit.
