A rollicking, heart-warming winter tale for all ages, *The Littlest Yak* comes to Lakeside Arts for the Christmas period. Nominated for **four OffWestEnd Awards** at this year's Offies, this musical adaptation of Lu Fraser and Kate Hindley's award-winning picture book will delight audiences young and old with beautiful puppets, catchy tunes, and an uplifting message of self-acceptance.

Gertie is great at being THE LITTLEST YAK, with the CURLIEST, WHIRLIEST wool and the GRIPPIEST of hooves for clip-clopping up cliffs. Only, Gertie doesn't want to be the littlest. Its relatable little hero reminds us all to celebrate our unique talents and the joy of belonging.
